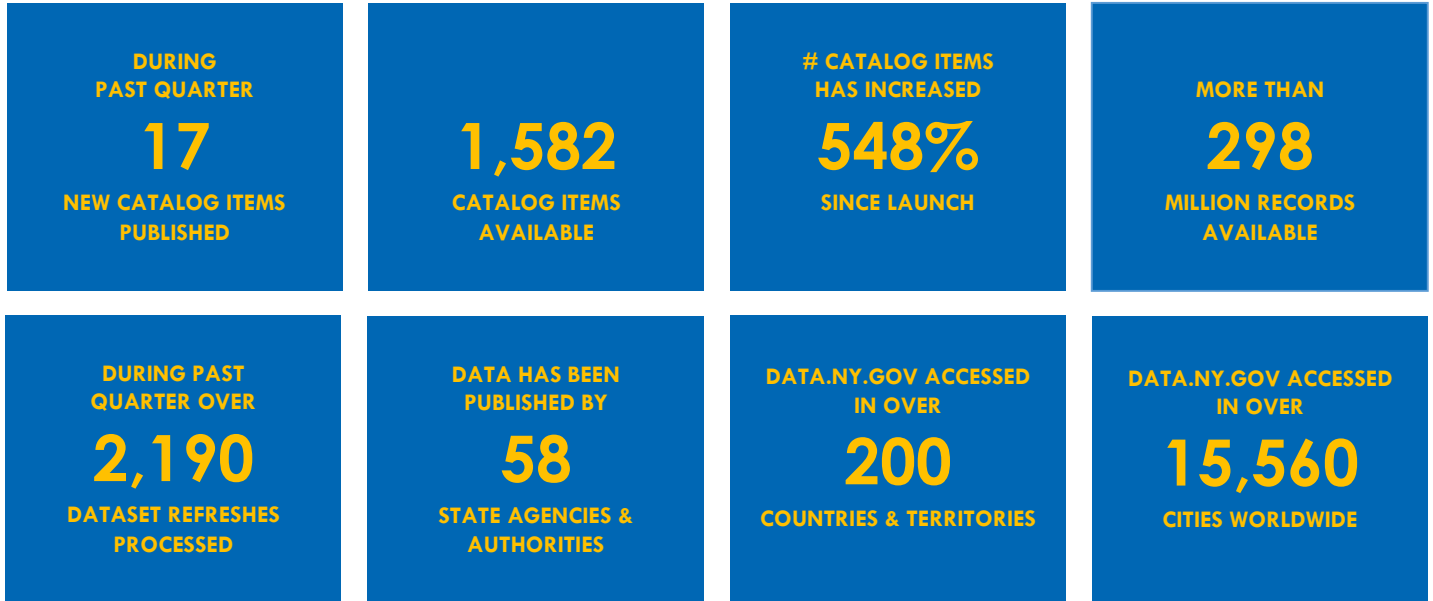




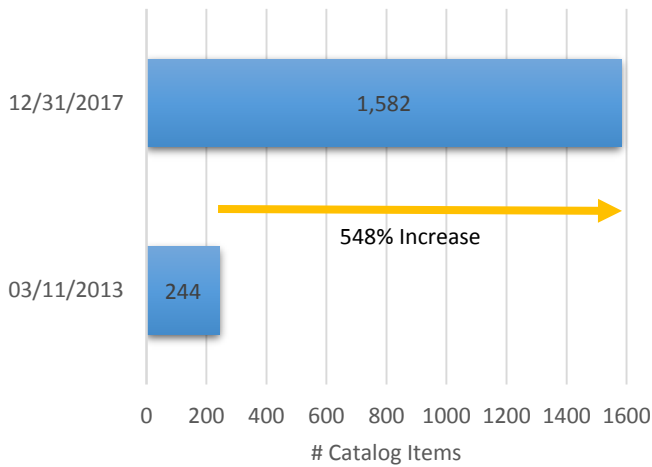
Open NY Fast Facts



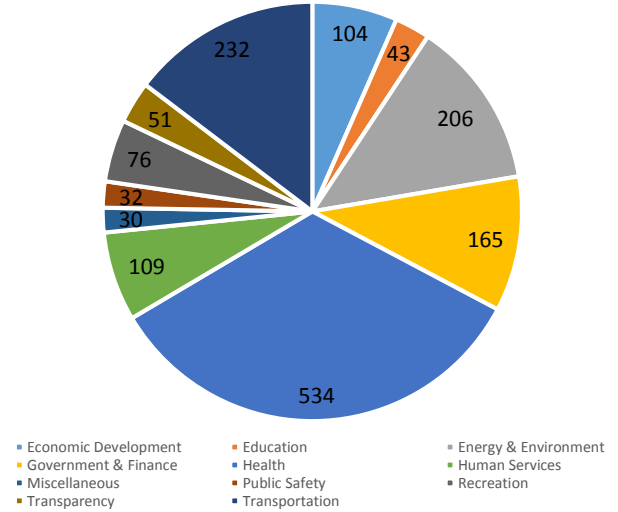
Highlights

- Many people would be surprised to learn that New York has one of the largest percentages of [both state land and state-managed conservation easements](#) in the United States. And more than 90% of this state-managed land – some 4.6 million acres – is managed by the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC). This land includes some of the most spectacular scenery in New York, and includes every major ecosystem type in the state, ranging from the salt marshes of Long Island to the alpine tundra of the Adirondack High Peaks. These lands are held in trust by DEC for the people of New York State and represent a legacy of more than 100 years of land acquisition and stewardship.
- **New York Department of Health - Using our own open data to gain internal efficiency and better consumer experiences**
The New York State Department of Health, Health Data NY team, through a grant with the US Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, partnered with a team of researchers and student scientists from the Center for Technology in Government (CTG), University at Albany. The goal was to improve internal Department processes to save the time it takes to publish visualizations and improve the usability of those visualizations for users. The collaboration produced code that is portable and durable and can be adapted across various open data set topic areas. In one case, NYS DOH applied CTG’s process to eliminate between one to two months of effort for one full time employee to recreate data tables on the public web. 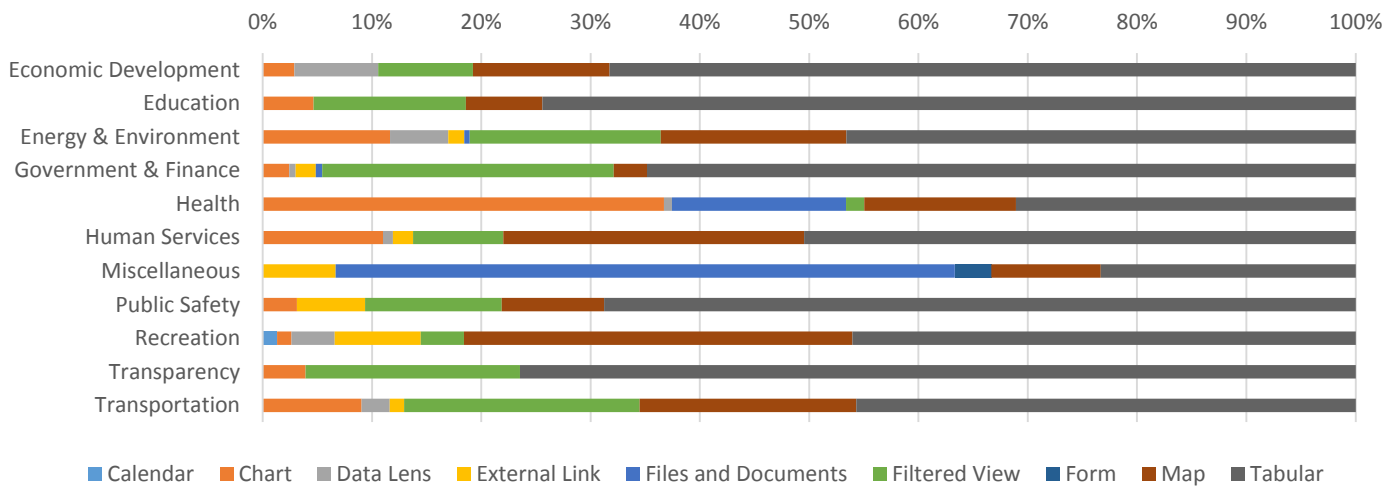
Open Data NY Growth



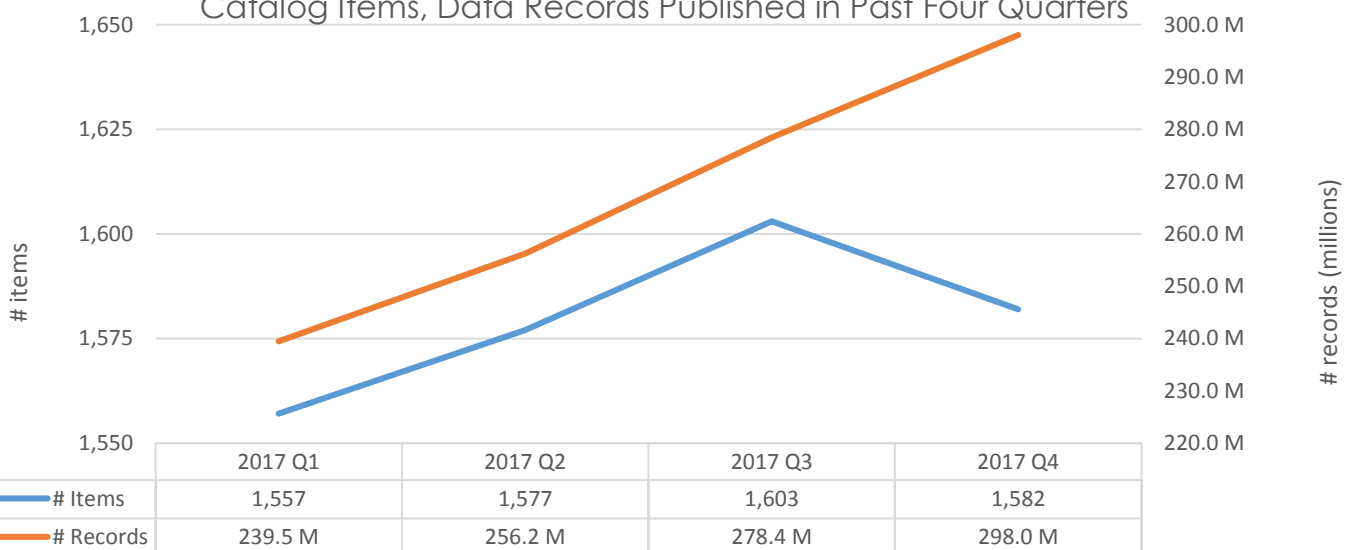
Catalog Items by Category
