A	DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY SERVICES OFFICE	Text	Name of the Developmental Disability Service Office(DDSO) area in which a Service provider's main office is located. A DDSO is a sub-unit of an OPWDD regional/state operations office.
B	SERVICE PROVIDER AGENCY	Text	Service provider main office agency name
C	STREET ADDRESS	Text	Service provider main office agency address
D	STREET ADDRESS LINE 2	Text	Service provider agency main office address (second line)
E	CITY	Text	Service provider agency main office city
F	STATE	Text	Service provider agency main office state
G	ZIP CODE	Text	Service provider agency main office zip code
H	PHONE	Text	Service provider agency main office phone number.
I	COUNTY	Text	Service provider agency main office county. <b><i>Services offered may be delivered in the same or different county (or counties) than the county of the service provider agency main address listed. The county is not necessarily that of the DDSO.</i></b>
J	WEBSITE URL	Text	Service provider agency World Wide Web Universal Resource Locator address (URL).
K	INTERMEDIATE CARE FACILITIES (ICF'S)	Text	ICFs serve individuals who are unable to care for their own basic needs, require heightened supervision and structure, support and resources The service provider offers services of this type (Y if yes, N if no) based on current enrollments.

<b>L</b>	INDIVIDUAL RESIDENTIAL ALTERNATIVE (IRA)	Text	An Individualized Residential Alternative (IRA) is a type of community residence that provides room, board and individualized service options. Service provider offers services of this type (Y if yes, N if no) based on current enrollments.
<b>M</b>	FAMILY CARE	Text	OPWDD's Family Care program provides community-based residential housing in certified private homes for individuals with developmental disabilities. Service provider offers services of this type (Y if yes, N if no) based on current enrollments.
<b>N</b>	SELF-DIRECTION SERVICES	Text	Self-direction of services allows participants to have the responsibility for managing all aspects of service delivery. Self-direction of services with the exercise of employer authority, budget authority or both is the ultimate control that can be undertaken. Service provider offers services of this type (Y if yes, N if no) based on current enrollments.
<b>O</b>	INDIVIDUAL SUPPORT SERVICES (ISS)	Text	Individual Supports Services (ISS) assists adults with developmental disabilities who wish to live independently by providing funds to pay for housing costs, and on a limited basis, for such things as food, transportation and clothing. Service provider offers services of this type (Y if yes, N if no) based on current enrollments.
<b>P</b>	DAY TRAINING	Text	Day training provides meaningful activities during the day for individuals with more significant challenges. Service provider offers services of this type (Y if yes, N if no) based on current enrollments.
<b>Q</b>	DAY TREATMENT	Text	Day treatment is a day service provided to individuals whose disabilities preclude them from a great deal of independent activity. Service provider offers services of this type (Y if yes, N if no) based on current enrollments.

<b>R</b>	SENIOR/GERIATRIC SERVICES	Text	Senior/Geriatric services are provided to support individuals with developmental disabilities who are also aging. Service provider offers services of this type (Y if yes, N if no) based on current enrollments.
<b>S</b>	DAY HABILITATION	Text	Day Habilitation services can assist individuals to acquire, retain or improve self-help, socialization and adaptive skills, including communication, travel and other areas in adult education. Service provider offers services of this type (Y if yes, N if no) based on current enrollments.
<b>T</b>	WORK SHOP	Text	A day program where a person with developmental disabilities works in a sheltered environment, typically for sub-minimum wage. **There are no longer new admissions for workshops. Service provider offers services of this type (Y if yes, N if no) based on current enrollments.
<b>U</b>	PREVOCATIONAL	Text	Prevocational services assist individuals who are interested in employment but whose skills are such that they may not expect to obtain competitive employment within the next year. Service provider offers services of this type (Y if yes, N if no) based on current enrollments.
<b>V</b>	SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT ENROLLMENTS	Text	Supported Employment (SEMP) offers supports for individuals who are seeking competitive employment. Service provider offers services of this type (Y if yes, N if no) based on current enrollments.

<b>W</b>	COMMUNITY HABILITATION	Text	Community habilitation helps individuals with developmental disabilities that live independently or at home with family to learn and experience community based activities. Service provider offers services of this type (Y if yes, N if no) based on current enrollments.
<b>X</b>	FAMILY SUPPORT SERVICES	Text	Family support services help an individual with developmental disabilities by supporting his or her family to care for him or her in the family home. Service provider offers services of this type (Y if yes, N if no) based on current enrollments.
<b>Y</b>	CARE AT HOME WAIVER SERVICES	Text	The Care At Home Waiver program allows Medicaid to pay for some services not provided through "regular" Medicaid, such as case management, respite, home adaptations and vehicle modification. Service provider offers services of this type (Y if yes, N if no) based on current enrollments.
<b>Z</b>	DEVELOPMENTAL CENTERS AND SPECIAL POPULATION SERVICES	Text	Campus-Based, Developmental Treatment Services (ICF/DC) settings are intended primarily for short-term interventions prior to returning to the community. They house individuals with major behavioral challenges and other highly intensive needs. Service provider offers services of this type (Y if yes, N if no) based on current enrollments.
